<p><i>Danforth representatives, TR Casamento and Michael Haen were present to provide an energy project update and to address committee questions</i></p> <p><i>Mr. Casamento stated that the project is substantially complete outside of some "punch-list" items, the biggest of which is the relocation of 4 heat pumps to provide better access.</i></p> <p><i>Once the project is deemed substantially complete, with the project manager signing off, will start the guaranteed period for energy savings.</i></p> <p><i>Within 60 days, a verification report will be submitted that will show what the savings are.</i></p> <p><i>Chairman Berwanger stated that energy cost \$87K more in 2018 than the year before. This is a \$3.6M contract</i></p> <p><i>HVAC is J. Ferris' responsibility and he stated that the dipswitches were initially set incorrectly and were not corrected until about 2 weeks ago. Should now show a savings... He also stated that twice the amount of filters are being used now which is twice the cost. This should be shown as a negative in the cost analysis.</i></p> <p><i>Supervisor Leuer, T/Middlebury asked if recommendations for future usage will be made. M. Haen stated that is separate.</i></p> <p><i>Supervisor Davis, T/Covington stated that lower rates from the energy auction will cut into the County's savings.</i></p> <p><i>Chairman Berwanger stated there has been confusion where the savings are...</i></p> <p><i>TR Casamento and M. Haen both agreed to go "above and beyond" and look at utility bills to evaluate and compare use vs cost. . This is not typically done but will do it due to concerns.</i></p> <p><i>A one-year picture, from one year after substantial completion, will show true savings.</i></p> <p><i>TR Casamento stated it is guaranteed to save units of energy and there should be some savings during the construction period. Year after year, energy use will tell... There were over 80 facility improvements and it is a case-by-case basis.</i></p> <p><i>J. Ferris will be the person to accept "substantial completion" once he is satisfied. That will start the 60-day window.</i></p> <p><i>Buildings and Grounds will receive the report and will bring it through Committee.</i></p>

A tributary of Crow Creek passes through a culvert in the Town of Orangeville, and due to elevation issues, it is impeding the seasonal migration of trout upstream. Buffalo Niagara Waterkeeper has some funding available for this project but not enough to cover the entire cost. This is the last year this money will be available and the project must be done between June 1st and Sept. 15 as this is a trout stream. They have requested financial assistance from the T/Orangeville to complete the project. Due to the size of the proposed replacement culvert, the responsibility of this would then pass to Wyo. Co. (anything over 3' around). There was extensive discussion concerning the County's position on this responsibility and suppling financial assistance. Wyo. 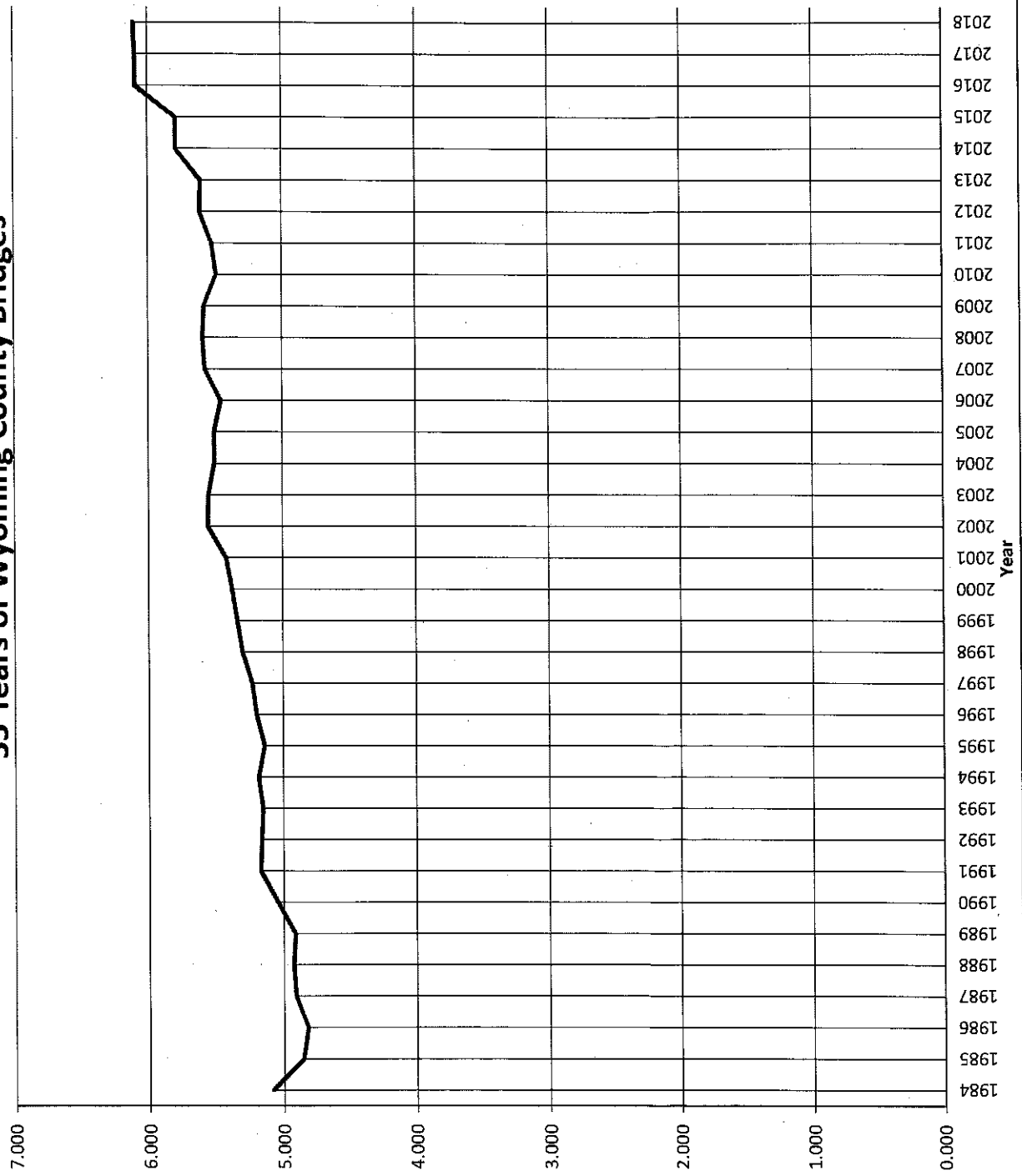

- CR #13 – Old State Rd 3.52 miles (Rt. 19 to Peoria) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #16 – Peoria Rd 1.28 miles (Old State Rd to Rt. 63) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #29 – Lamont Rd 3.81 miles (Rt. 19 to Rt. 39) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #24 – East Koy Rd 2.79 miles (Rt. 19 to Lamont Rd) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #50 – N. Water St 0.83 miles (Rt. 19 to Rt. 39) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #57 – Poplar Tree Rd 1.53 miles (Rt. 78 to Mote Rd) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up

The following 6.98 (2.9 %) miles of roads were overlaid with 1 ½" 9.5mm Polymer Modified Superpave Asphalt Concrete Warm Mix Top:

- CR #38 – Denton Corners Rd (Rt.436) - 1.80 miles (Rt. 19A to Rt. 39) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #34 – Centerline Rd – 2.86 miles (Rt. 77 to Dutch Hollow Rd) (mill 1 ½" prior to overlay) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #38 – Denton Corners Rd – 1.82 miles (Rt. 19A to Letchworth State Park) (1" shim prior to overlay) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #55 – Glen Iris Rd – 0.50 miles (Denton Corners Rd to Castile Town Line) (2 ½" 19.0mm Polymer Modified Warm Mix Binder prior to overlay) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up.

The following 4.05 (1.7 %) miles of roads were overlaid with 1 ½" 12.5mm Polymer Modified Superpave Asphalt Concrete Warm Mix Top:

- CR #29 – East Koy Rd – 0.77 miles (Lamont Rd to Wiscoy Rd) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up
- CR #33 – Lamont Rd – 0.75 miles (East Koy Rd to Clute Rd) w/ -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up

- CR #2 – Broughton Rd (Rt. 19 to Rt. 19A) 2.53 miles – The project involved a 1½" overlay of WM 12.5mm Polymer Modified Superpave Top and -2" screened millings for shoulder back-up. The road was milled a 1 ½" from Rt 19A to King St prior to the overlay. This project was funded under the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

The following 1.44 (0.6 %) miles of roads were overlaid with 2 ½” 19.0mm Superpave Asphalt Concrete Warm Mix Binder:

- CR #29 – Wiscoy Rd – 1.44 miles (East Koy Rd to Allegany County Line) w/ - 2” screened millings for shoulder back-up

The following 18.60 (7.7 %) miles of roads were crack sealed with a polymer modified sealer to prevent water intrusion into existing cracks:

- CR #1 - Dale Rd (Old Buffalo Rd to Vernal Rd) - 4.84 miles
- CR #1 - Skates Hill Rd (W. Middlebury to County Line) - 0.56 miles
- CR #6 - Buffalo/View (Rt 39 to Castile Village Limit) - 0.41 miles
- CR #14 - Liberty St (Hermitage Rd to Curtis Rd) - 2.96 miles
- CR #22 - Silver Lake Rd (Oatka Rd to Standpipe Rd) - 0.63 miles
- CR #26 - Bullis Rd (Rt 354 to County Line) - 0.89 miles
- CR #31 - Exchange St (Rt 238 to Dunbar Rd) - 1.35 miles
- CR #35 - Dutch Hollow Rd (Rt 20A to Rt 78) - 4.56 miles
- CR #40 - School Rd (Lamont Rd to Rt 19A) - 2.40 miles

HIGHWAY REHABILITATION

-CR #46 – Telegraph Rd (Dewitt Rd to Centerville Rd) 4.75 miles – Installed concrete gutters, 1” Superpave Warm Mix 6.3mm Polymer Modified Top and final shoulder back-up w/ -2” screened millings. This project was funded by the Capital Improvement Program.

-CR #13 – Simmons Rd (Rt. 20A to Old State Rd) 5.17 miles – The existing 20’ wide road was rehabilitated to 26’ wide using Cold-In-Place recycling to include the following: 4” of existing pavement and add stone was recycled and overlaid with 3” Superpave Warm Mix 19mm Binder, 1” Superpave Warm Mix 6.3mm Polymer Modified Top and - 2” screened millings for shoulder back-up. This project was funded by the Capital Improvement Program.

SHOULDER REHABILITATION

-CR #39 – Cascade Road (Rt. 238 to Exchange St) 1.38 centerline miles – The existing 20’ wide road was widened to 26’. A milling machine removed the existing gravel shoulder and broken edges and we replaced it with 4” of asphalt binder.

LARGE DIAMETER CULVERTS

The following large diameter culverts were replaced:

- Java #22 – Beaver Meadow Rd (6'x12' (4 sided) x 76' long)
- Warsaw #32 – Wyoming St (5'x13' (4 sided) x 80' long)
- Middlebury #22 – Lemley Rd (8' dia. used CMP x 30' long)
- Middlebury #32 – School Rd (8' dia. used CMP x 30' long)

BRIDGE

- Bennington #14 – Schad Rd (10'x30' (3 sided) x 50' long) - The existing reinforced concrete slab superstructure was completely replaced with a new 3 sided structure placed on a precast invert slab. The roadway was raised to improve the substandard sag curve and allow guiderail to be utilized in lieu of bridge rail. This project was funded under the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (Bridge NY).

OTHER

In addition to the above mentioned projects, many other necessary tasks were accomplished such as:

- Bridge and Large Diameter Culvert Repairs (see attached)
- Bridge Washing – all structures
- Bridge Sealing – applied penetrating sealer to approximately 1/3 of the bridge decks that have concrete decks (3 year cycle).
- Large Diameter Culvert paved inverts – placed a paved concrete invert inside 6ea. existing metal pipes to extend the service life of the existing pipe.
- Cleaned 156 of the 290 catch basins.
- Cross Culvert replacement and repair.
- Cutting of built-up shoulders – 2.9 centerline miles (both sides).
- Ditching – 10.6 centerline miles (4.4%) (3,922 CY of spoils removed).
- Driveway Culvert replacement and repair.
- Pavement Markings – all center & edge lines as well as stop bars and railroad crossings. We have continued selectively installing preformed tape on Stop Bars to see if the longevity outweighs costs.
- Roadside cleanup (ROW) of all county roads in the spring.
- Roadside mowing.
- Shoulder back-up (on existing low shoulders (excluding project work above)) – 3.7 lane miles.
- Shoulder washouts.

- Sign manufacture, repair and replacement – Approximately 112 signs were replaced, 86 repaired, 9 removed, 18 installed new of the approximately 2,921 total and 18 delineators were installed.
- Snow & Ice Control including sweeping roadways in the spring
- Snow Fence maintenance/installation/removal (2,900 LF of permanent, 13,100 LF of 4' high & 0 LF of 8' high).
- Tree & Brush Removal.
- Deer Removal – 77 carcasses removed from County Roads.

- Work for County Departments/Agencies:
 - Buildings & Grounds – supplied labor to assist with Animal Control rehabilitation.
 - Emergency Services – mowed field for the Merchant Rd Tower line of sight to Warsaw and shooting range at FTC. Also repaired Burn Tower.
 - County Historian – sandblasted Portageville RR Bridge plate and deliver to their office.
 - WCCH – mowed bank behind hospital, hauled and repaired equipment, installed signs, installed cold patch and removed snow.
 - All Towns and Villages – continued maintaining and operating a boom mower in which many towns utilized to remove trees/brush along Town Roads. In addition, we moved equipment, operated our large excavator for pipe crossings, assist in multiple bank stabilization projects, cut rebates, removed stumps as requested and assisted with sign surveys and snow removal. We also made our loader/shoulder widener available to any town for their use.
