Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of earlier today, Wednesday, December 03, 2020, the Wyoming County Health Department reports five hundred seventeen (517) lab-confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of twenty-four (24) cases from the last reported increase on Wednesday, December 02, 2020.

Wyoming County is experiencing widespread community transmission of COVID-19. Please wear face coverings, maintain social distance, practice good hand hygiene and do not be around others if you are sick.
